Vendor Set-Up Information

- 1. Vendor set up may begin on Thursday Morning April 10th. If more advanced time is needed, just let us know and arrangements can be made. Take down will occur after public hours on Sunday, April 13th. You may stay over and depart on Monday morning if desired.
- 2. Public hours are: Friday 9 am 5 pm, Saturday 9am- 5pm and Sunday 9am- 4pm.
- 3. Vehicles will not be permitted in camp during public hours or overnight and may only be in camp for the use of loading and unloading.
- 4. The local Boy Scout troop and student volunteers are being requested to assist with loading and unloading.
- 5. Some demonstrators and vendors will be assigned cabin space. Prior year participants will be given first preference. You may request set-up at either the Old Bardstown Village or at Wickland Estate. Tent location will be assigned and you will receive a vendor package 4 weeks prior to the event with cabin or tent assignment and maps. PLEASE SPECIFY IF YOU HAVE A PREFERENCE FOR SET-UP AT THE OLD VILLAGE OR WICKLAND ESTATE.
- 6. This event includes many venues so participants are asked to remain in period dress while in camp, day or night.
- 7. Blanket traders will be limited to (1) regular sized blanket.
- 8. Firewood, straw and water will be made available. Ice will be available for purchase. Some of the cabins have working fireplaces, most do not. Fire pits will be allowed outside of tents with the usual requirements of safe distances from canvas and a fire bucket.
- 9. Vendors may sleep in their vendor tents or cabins. Additional period camping is also available at Wickland Estate, within walking distance. The military and civilian re-enactors will be encamped at Wickland. There is also various lodging available in town within walking distance. A modern campground with utilities and showers is available at My Old KY Home State Park Campground, but is not in walking distance. Re-enactor Set-Up Information

- 1. Civilian and Military period encampment will be located on the grounds of the Wickland Estate, only a few blocks from the Old Bardstown Village and Talbott Tavern. Set up may begin on Thursday Morning, April 10th. Take down will occur after public hours on Sunday, April 13th. Breakdown and departure on Monday is acceptable.
- 2. Re-enactors may register at the gate, but pre-registration is requested. Advance registration is required for the Wickland Ball on Saturday evening and attendance is limited, so early registration is encouraged.
- 3. Public hours for the encampment are: Friday 9am 5 pm, Saturday 9am 5pm and Sunday 9am 4pm. We encourage set-up on Thursday, but understand some re-enactors cannot arrive until Friday and we will accommodate you. Please try to unload your vehicle on the drive during public hours, or have them in and out as quickly as possible if absolutely necessary.
- 4. Firewood, straw, water and restrooms will be available. Ice will be available for purchase at Boone's Depot adjacent to the site.
- 5. Areas will be designated for the military and civilian camping, but specific tent sites will not be assigned. The grounds at Wickland Estate are flat and easily accessible, and there is no shortage or limitation on space.
- 6. Showers and Modern camping is available at My Old KY Home State Park Campground. For information on lodging and modern camping go to: www.visitbardstown/tourism

Rules and Regulations

- 1. Failure to follow all rules and regulations or expulsion from the event may result. Fees will not be refunded.
- 2. Modern firearms are not permitted in camp.
- 3. No discharge of period firearms is permitted anywhere other than the rifle range during designated hours or during scheduled tactical events.
- 4. Fire pits must be a minimum of 6 inches deep and 5 feet from any canvas or combustible material.
- 5. Alcoholic beverages may not be consumed during public hours! After hours, all beverages must be in period containers and cups.
- 6. This is a period camp, both before and after hours. Please keep all modern items out of site at all times.
- 7. The time period is strictly adhered to. Clothing may not be earlier than 1770 nor later than 1810. Fringe may not be more than 1" long. Deer antler buttons, seed beads long fringe, war shirts, "dead animal hats", or apparel commonly accepted to be mountain man or west of the Mississippi River will not be allowed. Clothing, gear and merchandise must be appropriate to the time and place that the event is trying to portray.
- 8. The Ball at Wickland Estate is open to all forms of attire including formal, poor, military, native, etc.
- 9. Merchants may not sell: bamboo flutes, items packaged in plastic, modern craft items, dream catchers, plastic toys, western Indian related merchandise, pop guns, medieval related items, fantasy or sci-fi items, original artifacts, furs of domesticated animals, items with non-period colors, or clothing made of non-period fabrics.
- 10. Mexican blankets may not be sold, used as table covers or otherwise displayed in public view.
- 11. The word of the event staff, jury and directors is final. If you are asked to put something away, please comply. If you feel there is an error, please present your appeal in writing along with 3 forms of primary documentation to the jury or event coordinators.
- 12. Violation of any rule will result in a warning. A third offense for the same violation will result in expulsion from the event.


